# 〇 創意凌天際·書香滿校園(

本校圖書館主任及中文科主任於月前接受《香港中學生文藝月刊》訪問,介紹本校閱讀及寫作計劃。

鼓勵同學多看書是我們一直堅持的工作。我們為了讓同學習慣涉獵不同科目的課外書,推行了「學科閱讀獎勵計劃」,指導中一至中四的學生廣泛閱讀,使他們在初中的啟蒙階段盡量吸收各方面的知識。在「不能偏吃,更不許不吃」的全面閱讀計劃下,同學的心智得以攝取豐富的營養,以幫助他們日後茁壯成長。



圖書館設計的「知源摘記」課業要求同學接觸百科全書,並摘記所閱讀的內容,以加深印象。為鼓勵及方便同學閱讀,百科全書均經過細心分拆包裝,以消弭同學對厚重書籍的恐懼。十年耕耘以來,學生閱讀的質與量均有明顯進步,而圖書館的藏書量也不斷增加,以滿足同學閱讀的需求。



在寫作方面,中文科除了日常的作業外,還為學生設計了多個課餘閱讀及寫作項目。同學在初中階段已透過全面的閱讀計劃鞏固了語文基礎,到了中四級以上,便需要學以致用,嘗試不同類型的文體創作。「閱讀啟發寫作」計劃為高年級同學提供自由創作的機會,當中的精彩作品更會編纂成書,名之曰《我的心靈字典》。選修「中國文學」的同學更有機會透過戲曲加深對中國倫理及禮儀風俗的認識。今年的寫作題目《長平公主初會周世顯》應會為同學的創意提供無盡的飛躍空間!

## Inter-school Oral Practice Workshop

On 25th and 28th November 2011, two groups of S.6 and S.7 LPS students participated in an 'Inter-school Oral Practice' workshop in the school hall of Pope Paul VI College. Hosted by the English Department of the school and attended by senior form students from several secondary schools in the Tsuen Wan and Kwai Ching districts, the workshop aimed to help participants from each school prepare for the Speaking Section of their HKALE and HKDSE English exams.

The workshop was conducted in the same format as the official public exams, featuring both group interaction and individual presentation. Moreover, students from the same school were not allowed to sit in the same group during the workshop, so they had to interact with students from other schools, which imitated the scenario in the real public exams.

In each workshop, students were given 3 sets of discussion topics. All the students were enthusiastic and eager to express their views during the whole workshop as if they were taking the real oral exam! At the end of the oral practice workshop, students were encouraged to give some feedback to their peers in the same group regarding their performance.

Overall, the workshop was a great success as it not only served as a platform to help students familiarize themselves with the oral exam atmosphere, but also to discover their strengths and weaknesses in their oral skills. Some students even made friends with their group mates and exchanged contact information! How fruitful the workshop was!

I was most impressed by the excellent oral English skills of the Pope Paul VI College students in my practice group.
