To build on the knowledge acquired in this programme, I have kindly been granted a golden opportunity by my alma mater to teach an English class on Saturdays, which is the best way for me to integrate the "theories" with "practice" in a practical way.

You can also learn through reading. Undoubtedly, textbooks are useful, yet you might be bored if you read them over and over. Moreover, it is unlikely that all the topics in a textbook are appealing to you. So, if you are fond of fashion, you could read English fashion magazines; if you love politics and economics, you could read an English newspaper; if you like reading stories, you could opt for a novel. It is entirely in your hands.

Practicing listening and reading may seem to be a passive way of learning English. If you like learning English actively, you may want to participate in the English Society and chat with your NET teachers. Your NET teachers are fun and friendly. They would love to be friends with you, so feel free to share your interests and thoughts with them. I am sure they would be delighted to see you at recess or lunchtime. By joining the English Society, you would find that English is not only a subject, but a bridge to connect with the world. I am sure your knowledge of English and your understanding about Western culture would be broadened by chatting with a native speaker of English.
